- Start Hepatitis B series (3 vaccinations)
- WSP Criminal History check
- PPD or TB skin test – complete 1st qtr

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Students learn the essentials of drawing blood, the role of the phlebotomist, safety and infection control, blood collection equipment, specimen processing, simple “waived testing” and practice with equipment on classmates. Upon successful completion of didactic and student lab practice, students register for a practicum work experience.



PROGRAM OUTCOMES

Students are prepared for entry level positions as a phlebotomist after two quarters.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Job prospects in the Puget Sound area are excellent, as there are shortages of phlebotomists. Salaries typically range from \$10 to \$14 per hour, and increase with continued education and experience.

POTENTIAL POSITIONS

Phlebotomists typically find work at clinics, blood banks, physician’s offices, hospitals, medical laboratories, and research laboratories.

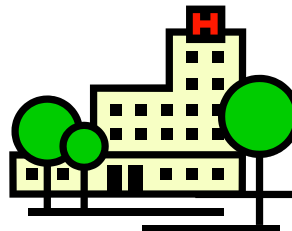
