




# Technology for Professional Careers




**Business Certificate / Degrees:** After you complete your certificate at Shoreline, you can transfer your credits into various AAAS degree programs. These include *Business Technology, Business Administration, Accounting, Marketing, Fashion Merchandising, Entrepreneurship, Retail Management, General Business*. **Health Certificate / Degrees:** To earn a certificate or degree in a health education program, your English skills will need to be at English 101 for many of the programs. **IBEST Programs:** There are several other IBEST programs available. If you qualified for the Opportunity Grant, you can have 45 credits paid by the grant (TPC is only 19 credits). Other IBEST programs include *General Service Technology, CNC, Nursing Assistant Certified*.
