All scholarship recipients are expected to enroll in a minimum of 6 credit hours at the college and maintain a 3.0 GPA in music classes. Performance scholarship recipients are required to participate in at least one major performing ensemble each quarter.

Thank you for your interest in Shoreline Community college Music Department. Please make sure your application is received in the SCC Foundation office by 4:00pm - April 6th, 2012. You will be assigned an audition time soon thereafter.

All scholarship recipients are required to enroll in a minimum of 6 credit hours at the college and maintain a 3.0 GPA in all music classes. Music scholarship recipients are expected to participate in at least one major ensemble each quarter (Chorale, Shoreline Singers, Jazz Ensemble, Concert Band).

Your audition will consist of performing one piece for the scholarship committee. You will have about five minutes for your performance. You will not be asked to play scales, arpeggios, or other technical exercises, nor will you be asked to sight-read. The scholarship is based on your performance ability.

Your audition piece should be one that best displays your performance abilities. For most areas, your piece should be taken from the classical repertoire. Should you have a question as to the appropriateness of your selection, please contact the program chair:

You may bring your own accompanist or if desired we will provide one for you.

Make sure your application is complete. Include anything you feel is pertinent regarding your accomplishments.

Scholarship decisions usually take about 3 weeks. We will notify all applicants of the committee's decision. Award winners will be given 4 weeks to accept their scholarship after which time the scholarship may be awarded to another applicant.

Award recipients will be honored at the Spring Scholarship Celebration on May 16, 2012 on the SCC campus.
