HIGH SCHOOL COMPLETION (HSC):	 Earn your Washington State High School Diploma while completing your Associate Degree and transfer requirements Classes can count towards your high school requirements and your college degree requirements Graduate from high school and get your diploma before you graduate from Shoreline
GED:	 General Educational Development Test A test to determine if you have a high school level of education without completing all the requirements to get a diploma Receive a Certificate of Educational Competency before you graduate from Shoreline
AUTOMATIC DIPLOMA: ———	 Washington State High School Diploma issued with your Associate Degree, upon request Just complete your Associate Degree – no additional coursework or testing is required Receive your high school diploma at the same time as your Associate Degree

WHICH OPTION IS RIGHT FOR ME?

This depends on your personal preference and your transfer university requirements.

If none of your transfer universities requires a high school diploma, you can choose any of the three options.

However, if any one of the universities that you're applying to require transfer applicants to have college credit *after* high school graduation, you should choose **HSC or GED**. Completing one of these two options in your first few quarters will allow you enough time to earn the college credits you need to have after high school graduation.
