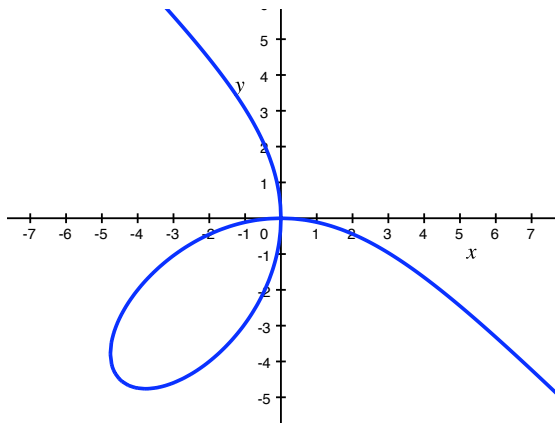
1. (16 pts.) Evaluate the following. You do not need to simplify your answer.

(a) (5 pts.) $\frac{d}{dt}[3\sqrt{\arctan(2t)} + e^\pi - 2t]$

(b) (5 pts.) If $f(x) = (2x + 1)^{e^x}$, what is $f'(x)$?

(c) (6 pts.) $\frac{d}{d\theta} \left[\frac{\cos^3(5\theta)}{\sin(\theta^2)} \right]$

2. (14 pts.) The curve shown below is $x^3 + 9xy = -y^3$.



(a) (2 pts.) Verify that the point $(-4, -2)$ is on the curve.

(b) (7 pts.) Find the equation of the tangent line of the curve at the point $(-4, -2)$.

(c) (5 pts.) Let $P = (x_1, -2.1)$ be a point on the curve near the point $(-4, -2)$. Using part (b) and linear approximation, estimate x_1 .

3. (24 pts.) Let $g(x) = e^{3x} \cos(3x)$ on the domain $[-1, 1.25]$.

(a) (6 pts.) What are the critical numbers of g in the domain?

(b) (4 pts.) For what intervals in the domain is g increasing? For what intervals is g decreasing?

(c) (5 pts.) For what intervals in the domain is g concave up? For what intervals is g concave down?

(d) (5 pts.) Find the local maximum and minimum values of g .

(e) (4 pts.) What are the absolute maximum and minimum values of g ?

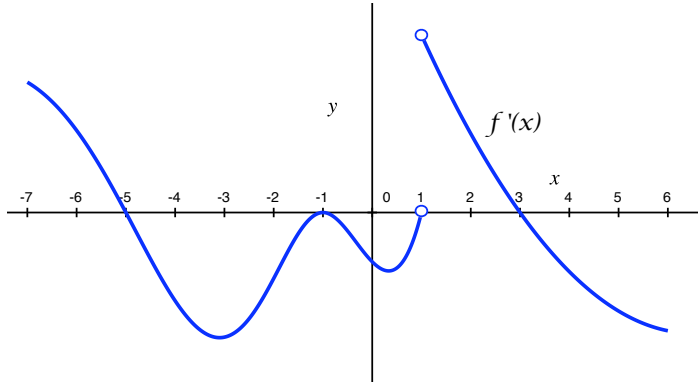
4. (12 pts.) Evaluate the following limits. Justify your answers.

(a) (4 pts.) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 3} \frac{\frac{3}{x^2} - \frac{1}{3}}{x-3}$

(b) (4 pts.) $\lim_{t \rightarrow 3^+} \frac{|t-3|}{t^2-3t}$

(c) (4 pts.) $\lim_{x \rightarrow \infty} \frac{\sqrt{4x^2+1}}{\sqrt{x^2+7}}$

5. (12 pts.) The following is a graph of $f'(x)$.



(a) (3 pts.) On what intervals is the function $f(x)$ increasing? On what intervals is $f(x)$ decreasing?

(b) (3 pts.) Assuming the function f is defined for all values in $[-7, 6]$, does f have local extreme values? If so, at what x -values does f have a local maximum? At what x -values does f have a local minimum?

(c) (3 pts.) For what x -values is the function f concave up? For what x -values is f concave down?

(d) (3 pts.) What are the x -coordinates of the inflection points of f ?

6. (9 pts.)

$$h(t) = \begin{cases} t^2 - t - \frac{1}{2}c & \text{for } t \leq 2 \\ (t-3)^3 + c & \text{for } t > 2 \end{cases}$$

(a) (4 pts.) For what value of c is the function h continuous on $(-\infty, \infty)$?

(b) (5 pts.) Given the value of c from part (a), is h differentiable at $t = 2$? Justify your answer.

7. (13 pts.) The product of 2 positive numbers is 48. How small can the sum of one of the numbers plus the cube of the other number be? Show your work and justify that your solution is an absolute minimum.
