ASSOCIATE IN ARTS – DIRECT TRANSFER AGREEMENT (AA-DTA)

The AA-DTA, known as the direct transfer degree, is an agreement between Washington State community colleges and baccalaureate institutions. The AA-DTA transfers as a package to most baccalaureate colleges and universities in Washington, satisfying most, if not all, of the lower division general education requirements and granting junior standing; it does not guarantee admissions. The AA-DTA requires 90 quarter credits in college-level courses numbered 100 or above with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher. **See the reverse side for a complete listing of courses that fulfill general education and distribution requirements.**

This planning guide is not designed for Shoreline’s AAAS degree Nursing program. It is for students planning to transfer to a four-year R.N. & B.S. Nursing program.

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

All schools: contact individual schools for application information.

- Programs are competitive; deadlines are early! Relevant volunteer/work experience is very important.
- Students transferring to U of W must meet high school core admissions requirements, including two years of the same world language in high school or two quarters in college. The third year/quarter of a language is a graduation requirement for students in the College of Arts & Sciences at U of W.
- NW University: Credit for ENGL& 102 will transfer with AA-DTA degree, however students must document additional competencies in writing. Fine Arts 2 credit requirement: Art, Drama or Music Appreciation is preferred over applied coursework. NW University prefers MATH 211, but will accept MATH& 146
