## University of Washington - Admission Information for the School of Business

Admission to the University of Washington School of Business Administration is competitive. Students must meet the admission requirements for the UW **and** for the Business School. Admission to the School of Business is contingent upon admission to the UW. For details on UW admission, contact the Office of Admissions at 206-543-9686. Students must complete *prerequisite* business courses with a minimum overall GPA of 2.5 and a 2.5 average for all business courses. The School of Business Administration admits only for Autumn and Winter Quarters. All students must write an essay in a proctored setting. A personal statement will also be required for admissions. For further details on the Business application, contact the UW School of Business at 206-685-3400. Students can also contact the Undergraduate Advising Center at 206/543-2551 or attend the UW School of Business Information Session offered every Thursday at 1:45 pm -2:30 in 191A Mary Gates Hall on the UW campus.

Transfer applicants are required to complete the High School Core Subjects requirements and are evaluated to see if their academic performance qualifies them for admission under the Direct Transfer Agreement. Without a community college Associate in Arts and Sciences or Associate in Sciences degree, students will be evaluated on an individual basis, and admission is more competitive. ### TRANSFER AGREEMENT

1. Students transferring from a Washington Community College are given high priority. The UW will (continue to) admit CC transfer students for a minimum of 30% of all incoming students.
2. Completion of High School Core Subjects (above) is REQUIRED of all incoming students, freshmen and transfer.
3. **Students will be selected for admission using a comprehensive review of GPA, preparation for major, completion of world language requirements, cultural awareness, documented academic and/or athletic talent, availability of desired program at other schools, work experience applicable to major, adversity they have overcome and more. See the UW website and/or handouts at the Student Development Center and FOSS building Information Desk for details.**
