

The most up-to-date information about college events and announcements will now be provided by the Public Information Office (PIO) on a daily basis via the intranet. Take a minute each morning to check **http://intranet.shore.ctc.edu** with your Internet browser, and you will immediately be connected. (Directions on setting up your browser to automatically call up the home page will be posted on the intranet.)

How do I submit information to PIO?

Please click onto the intranet home page and use the **News Submission Form** to send PIO details about your event or news item. It's that easy. We ask you to send us the information as early as possible, particularly if you would PIO to forward the information to the media.

Reminder: In order to have your event listed in a monthly or bi-monthly publication, you must submit this information to us at least 10 weeks in advance.

NET NEWS

Net News will be published every two weeks and will contain information about college initiatives, new employees, grant awards, recognition awards received by faculty and staff, and more. We will continue to send you an email reminder when the latest version of Net News has been published along with a brief look at the current edition's headlines.
