

SUSTAINABILITY POLICY

PROCEDURAL GUIDELINES

In accordance with existing federal, state, and local laws, it shall be the procedure of Shoreline Community College to:

- Promote the reduction of present and future risks of hazardous materials generated by the Shoreline campus.
- Meet or exceed the standards set by federal, state, and local laws pertaining to hazardous materials.
- Promote the purchase and use of products manufactured using recycled, reusable, and sustainably produced materials.
- Establish procedures to conserve resources and reduce waste in ongoing processes and continually develop waste reduction procedures.
- Maintain and improve recycling systems for non-hazardous materials.
- Promote conservation of energy, water, and other natural resources.
- Encourage conservation of fuels through the promotion of bus, van and carpool use, bicycles, and other sustainable methods.
- Increase the awareness of sustainability issues and practices through campus events, curriculum, and professional development.
- Promote improvements in indoor and outdoor air quality.
- Develop, to the fullest extent possible, capital master plans and projects consistent with principles of sustainability, which include but are not limited to improvements in air quality, storm water runoff, energy efficiency, and resource use.
- Strive to meet the goals of the Climate Action Plan in promoting climate neutrality and sustainability.
