

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Eastern Washington University (EWU)
and
Shoreline Community College (SCC)

Purpose:

To establish an agreement whereby the criteria for seamless transition of programs of study in Criminal Justice at SCC and EWU is established. Students who complete the course work identified by this agreement for award of an Associate of Applied Arts and Science (AAAS) degree in Criminal Justice at SCC will be granted Junior (3rd year) standing for study of criminal justice at EWU in criminal justice. This agreement is intended to eliminate duplication of course work and is consistent with the goals and objectives goals of both institutions. The conditions herein are subject to review prior to academic year 2001/2002 or sooner at the request of either party.

Assumptions:

Admission to the Criminal Justice Program at EWU requires a minimum grade point of 2.5
Students must complete 90 credit hours at EWU.
Students must have at least 60 credit hours of upper division (300 level).
The criminal justice major consists of 50 credit hours of mandatory courses.
There is no year level assigned to the 21 credit hours of criminal justice electives.
Residency requirements must be met.
Transcripts will reflect specific SCC course number for which credit is awarded based on experience or training.

General Education Core Requirements:

Pre-university basic skills (0-16 credits with 2.0 GPA)

- Computer literacy (exam or CPLA 100), 1 credit
- Writing (ENGL 100 or pass a writing test), 5 credits
- Mathematics (intermediate algebra), 5 credits

University competencies (0-6 credits with 2.0 GPA)

- Computer literacy (exam or CPLA 101), 1 credit
- Writing (ENG 101), 5 credits

University proficiencies (5 - 10 credits with 2.0 GPA)

- Writing (ENGL 201), 5 credits

Mathematics (0-5 credits) may be satisfied by the following courses:

1. MATH 115 (Mathematical reasoning)
2. MATH 106 (Precalculus mathematics II)
3. MATH 161 (Calculus I)
4. MATH 200 (Finite)
5. MATH 308 (Elementary probability statistics)
6. MATH 211 & 212 (Structure of Elementary Math I & II)

Core requirements (8 courses and 40 credits) are subject to a previously negotiated agreement.

Courses taken from humanities and fine arts, social sciences, and natural sciences. Two course from one area and three from the other two.

University graduation requirements

1. Cultural and Gender Diversity and International Studies
 - a. Eight (8) credits minimum; 4 from each area.
 - b. Only one course can be from the primary major department.
2. LAEC 310 (Human Identity), 4 hours
3. Senior capstone. CRIM 490 (5 hours)
4. Foreign language requirements: Our foreign language requirements can be met with two years of one language in high school or one year of a single college language. Currently, we offer American Sign Language, French, German, Japanese, Russian, and Spanish languages.
