OVERVIEW OF THE HONORS COLLEGE AT SHORELINE

- **13 Advanced Honors Courses** – an inexpensive way to complete your general education requirements in a small class with a cohort of other honors students who are serious about their education.
- **University of Washington Undergraduate Research Symposium Partnership** – Research Track students have been invited to present with upper division UW students for the past five years.
- **Washington State University's Honors College invitation and \$2,000 in scholarship support** – upon completion of the Honors College at Shoreline students are automatically accepted to WSU's honors college, with a renewable scholarship, with additional support for internships or study abroad.
- **Phi Theta Kappa Membership** - membership fees for Phi Theta Kappa International Honors Society is covered by the Honors College
- **Honors Student Council** - leadership opportunities are available through the Honors Student Council, which plans events such as volunteer opportunities, study groups, and other unique programming.
- **Ethnic Diversity** – White (39%), Multiracial (13%), Hispanic (11%), Asian/Pacific Island (9%), African American (5%) and International Students (14%)
- **Designated Honors Office and Honors Lounge** – spaces provided for individualized attention, support and an opportunity to engage in meaningful connections in a like-minded and close-knit community. Students receive support from a dedicated advisor, director, and two academic deans.
- **National Collegiate Honors Council member program** – The Honors College at Shoreline is a member of both national and regional collegiate honors organizations that provide professional development and research for honors faculty.
