

# Shoreline High School Completion (HSC) Program

# Course Options List

\*Please note the following:

- \* **This list is only a guide! Please consult with your academic advisor or the High School Completion Coordinator before choosing classes!**
- \* **This list is to be used along with your HSC Graduation Plan and your College Degree Plan. Do not register for HSC courses until you have consulted with your advisor or the HSC Coordinator.**
- \* HSC is “dual-credit” program, meaning classes taken for HSC may also count towards your college degree.
- \* A five-credit course at Shoreline is worth one high school unit.
- \* All courses listed are worth one high school unit, unless otherwise noted.
- \* Any course below the 100 level cannot be used for college or transfer credit and will only count towards HSC.
- \* All courses must have a grade of 1.0 or higher, or a P (pass) grade, to count towards HSC. A grade of 2.0 is usually required for all transfer coursework though.

3.	SCIENCE (3 units, 2 must include a lab component)	<b>Lab course options:</b> any Shoreline lab science course  <b>Non-lab course options:</b> any Shoreline non-lab science course, or COMPUTER SCIENCE 121, 141, 143, NUTRITION 101  Lab and non-lab options can be found <a href="#">here</a> .	
4.	SOCIAL STUDIES (3 units, must satisfy all three areas)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>U.S History</b> (1 unit): HISTORY 136, 137, or 37</li> <li>• <b>U.S. Government and Civics</b> (0.5 unit): POLITICAL SCIENCE 202</li> <li>• <b>Contemporary World Problems &amp; Social Studies Elective</b> (1.5 units): ANTHROPOLOGY (any, except 205), COMMUNICATION STUDIES 102, 203, 285, AMERICAN ETHNIC STUDIES 106, 119, 215, ECONOMICS 100, 201, 202, INTERNATIONAL STUDIES 101, 123, 201, 205, MULTICULTURAL STUDIES 105, PHILOSOPHY 102, 240, 248, 256, POLITICAL SCIENCE (any), PSYCHOLOGY (any, except 202), SOCIOLOGY (any), GENDER AND WOMEN’S STUDIES (any), any modern world history class</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>U.S History:</b> History 41 and 43 (both must be taken to earn 1 unit) at BYU</li> <li>• <b>U.S. Government &amp; Civics:</b> Government 41 at BYU (0.5 unit)</li> </ul>

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5.	FINE & PERFORMING ARTS (2 units)	<p>Any ART, ART HISTORY, MUSIC, DRAMA, CINEMA 201, VCT, FILM (some classes in these areas will only count for 0.5 unit if they are less than 4 college credits)</p> <p><b>NOTE:</b> You may be able to substitute another class for <b>one</b> of these units if it aligns with your college or career plan (usually a major-related or major prerequisite course). Must be approved by the HSC Coordinator.</p>	<p>Extracurricular arts/performance (dance, music lessons, etc.) may count if proof of participation can be provided.</p>
7.	WORLD LANGUAGE (2 units)	<p>This requirement is waived for students whose primary language is not English. The units can be made up in electives.</p> <p>If your primary language is English, you may take world language courses OR substitute in other courses that align with your college or career plan (usually a major-related or major prerequisite course). Must be approved by the HSC Coordinator. Please note that most universities have a world language (foreign language) requirement for native English speakers.</p>	
6.	HEALTH AND FITNESS (2 units)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Health</b> (0.5 unit): BIOLOGY 107, 150, 170, 211, 212, 241, 242, NUTRITION 188 (0.5 unit), 101</li> <li>• <b>Fitness/P.E.</b> (1.5 units): Any <b>two</b> PHYSICAL EDUCATION classes</li> </ul> <p><b>NOTE:</b> Depending on your HSC graduation plan, you may be able to satisfy both requirements by taking one P.E. class and one Health class (Biology 170 or Nutrition 101 only).</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Fitness/P.E.:</b> Extracurricular sports or physical activity participation (team sports, dance, etc.) may count if proof of participation can be provided.</li> </ul>
8.	CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION (1 unit)	<p>Any class used towards intended major prerequisites or career (math ok as long as it is a <i>major</i> prerequisite), or ACCT 201, 202, 203, ART studio or theory, any BUSINESS class, any BUSINESS TECH class, COMMUNICATION STUDIES 220, COMPUTER SCIENCE 121, 141, 143, 151 (0.5 unit), all ENGINEERING classes, MUSIC performance or theory, most PROF/TECH classes, any VCT class</p> <p><b>NOTE:</b> This course may be used to satisfy another core academic subject. However, if you choose this option, you must make up the credit with an elective, and it must be approved by the HSC Coordinator.</p>	
9.	ELECTIVES (4 units or enough to get to 24 total units)	<p>Any class that is not used to satisfy another area of HSC. Pre-college and college-level courses are ok.</p>
