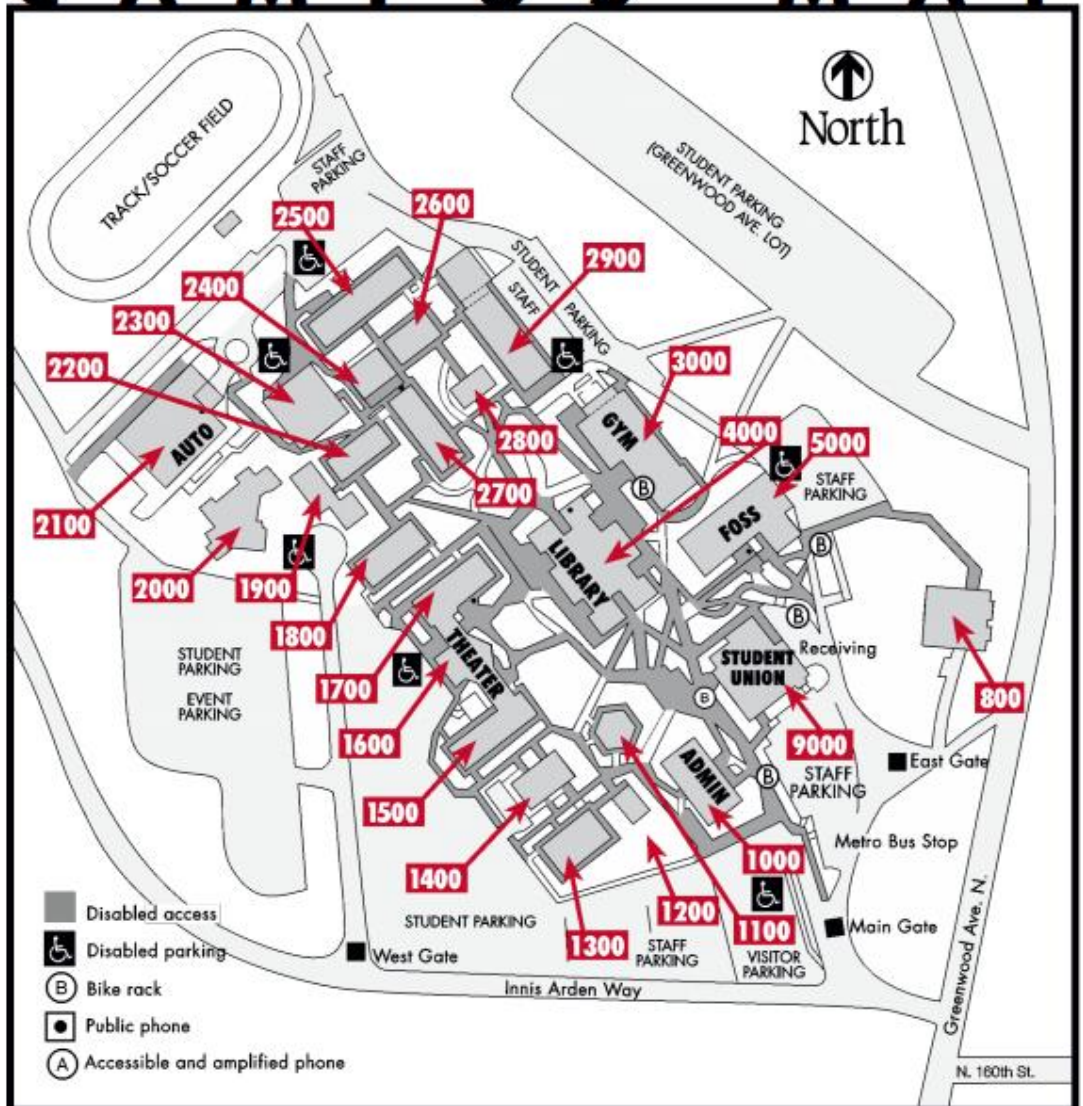

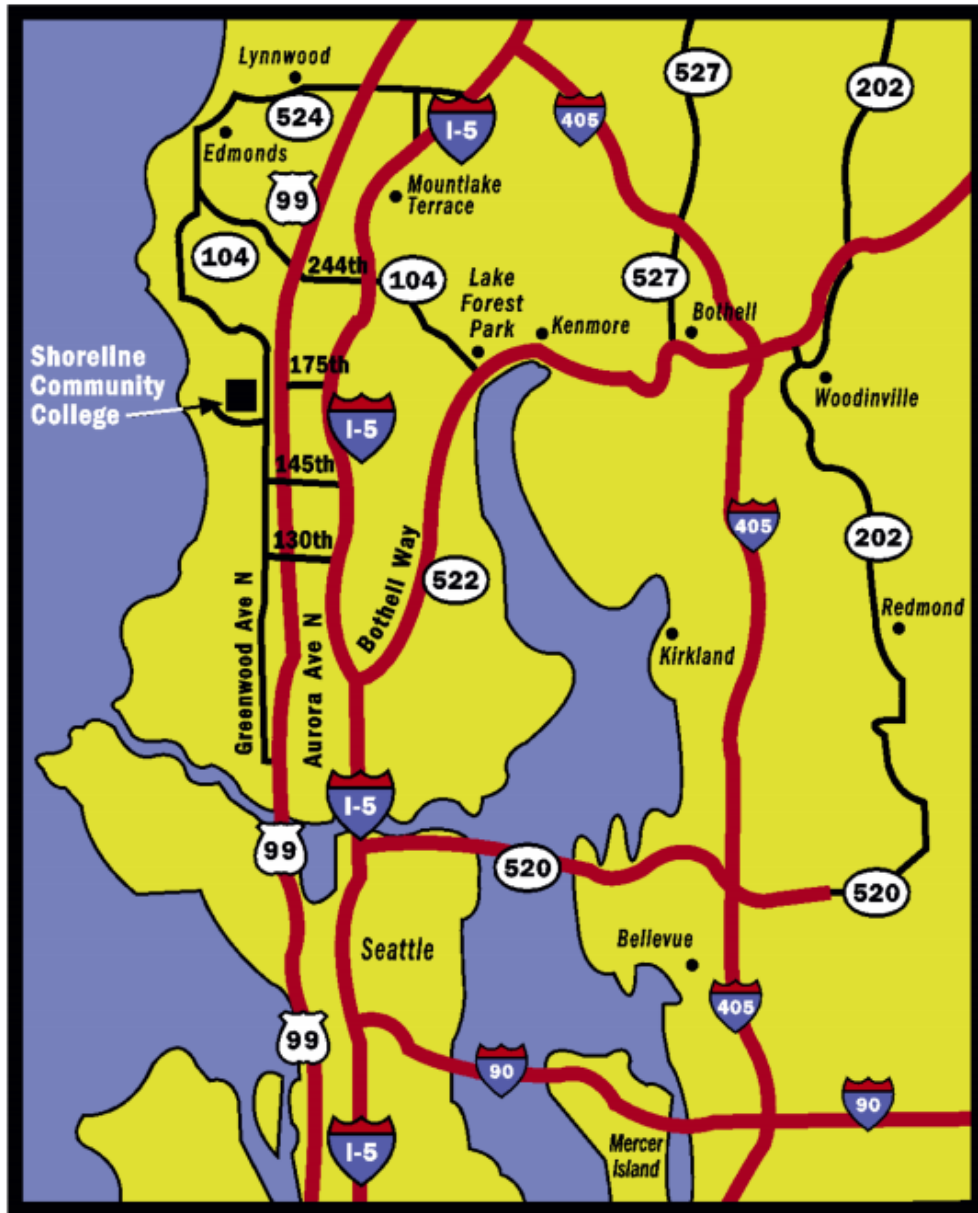
CAMPUS MAP

FROM THE NORTH:

Take I-5 south.

Exit at 175th Street.

- Go west on 175th St. to Aurora Ave. N. (Hwy 99).
- Go south on Aurora to 160th.
- Go west on 160th to Greenwood Ave. N.
- Go north on Greenwood then immediately west on Innis Arden Way.
- The main gate to the college is on your right.

FROM THE SOUTH:

Take I-5 north.

Exit at 145th Street.

- Go west on 145th St. to Aurora Ave. N. (Hwy 99).
- Go north on Aurora to 160th.
- Go west on 160th to Greenwood Ave. N.
- Go north on Greenwood then immediately west on Innis Arden Way.
- The main gate to the college is on your right.
