What is Service-Learning?

Service-Learning is a method of teaching, learning and reflecting that ***combines academic classroom curriculum with meaningful service in the community.***

Service-Learning courses allow students to engage in ***meaningful service opportunities in the community*** that purposefully overlap with and enhance the academic learning that occurs in the classroom.

Service-Learning is based on ***reciprocal partnerships*** between the student service-learning program and the community organization.

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Or

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What are the benefits?

A Service-Learning partnership:

- provides a means for meeting community defined needs
- promotes the empowerment of communities
- increases the visibility of a Community Partner organization
- highlights strengths and areas needing improvement
- increases Community Partner access to resources
- can bring new ideas and energy through service-learning students
- helps build and strengthen relationships between institutions of higher education and the surrounding community

How does it work?

Each quarter Community Partners list available service-learning opportunities in the online system.

Students are required to complete at least 15 hours at their partner site.

Community Partners can add additional requirements to each listing (e.g. must pass a background check) and limit the number of students they will take.

Community Partners provide an ***on-site orientation/training, supervision of service activities, sign the student hour log***, and take part in a ***Mid-Term Check-In***, and an ***End-of-Quarter Evaluation***.

A Service-Learning Coordinator is available to answer questions and provide assistance.
