#### 10:10 – 10:50 AAAS Curriculum Changes.....Dan King

- Proposal to make up for 5 missing credits from BUSTC 128 sunset by allowing students to select any 100-200 level BUSTC/BUS course (3-5 elective credits would increase to 8-10) *Concerns over sunsetting BUSTC 128 Word 365?* 
  - Kendyl: Less of a concern nowadays, with everything being done on the computer from a young age.

Janelle and Lisa agreed.

- Lisa: People usually come with that experience already. A Quickbooks class, etc. would be more useful. Having Quickbooks knowledge looks a lot better on a resume than a Word course.
- Kendyl: If a student feels weak in Word, there are campus resources to support them tutoring center, etc.

#### Thoughts on adjusting Math to ECON 201?

Kendyl: You can do ACCT without higher level math skills.

Lisa: Relies on Excel to do a lot of the math. ECON is more well-rounded and helps with concepts that are more applicable to focus on.

• The Committee shared concerns over lack of communication ability and professionalism among younger employees.

Lisa: Looking for a recent grad to apply.

### 10:50 – 11:10 Outcomes Assessment......Dan King

- The Committee reviewed ACCT program outcomes and grade data. Dan has reviewed the two across the 201-203 courses and seen what parts of the courses are difficult. Is adjusting assignments to better prepare them for the topics.
- Under-representation in the degree; students are mostly White females. Largely a recruiting issue.

Brad and Dan are improving ways to communicate with students. Many ignore emails, Canvas, etc. so hoping to establish a text messaging system instead.

Would allow for students to have immediate help with problems or issues.

- What is happening to address these issues?
  - Dan: Working on an SCC event as a recruiting effort.
  - Suzan: Is there outreach to high schools?
  - Lauren: SCC has a staff person housed in the high schools. We also look at CTE Dual Credit, where college credit is offered for high school classes.
  - Lucas: Trying to do the Big Event again, after it was success a few years ago. Will let students meet faculty, hear guest speakers, explore financial aid and ed plan, etc.
    - Working on ways to bring people back to campus. Not just for classes, but bookstore, events, etc.

Also exploring ways to reach out to the younger demographic, who don't like answering phones or emails
