SEIU has training funds – there are 200 people in nursing programs supported by SEIU training funds including 3 Shoreline Community College Nursing students receiving funds at this time

SEIU is exploring ways to train nurses for outpatient roles

Kathryn Ogden – Swedish

Swedish is collaborating with SPU on teaching design

The IV Smart Pumps are delayed possibly till Fall 2014

Looking for a Psych clinical nurse specialist

Exploring mid-level ARNP for ICU (family nurse practitioners)

Residency – hope to expand 300 new grads next year

They are starting a pilot program in May for nurses that are new to Acute Care Working

Brenda Neuman – Swedish/Edmonds

Swedish/Edmonds is under construction

The parking garage should be done within the next 2-3 months – then construction on the new building will start

Maintained a nice census – students are getting a good experience

Bar-coding of meds will be coming next May

A lot of upgrades need to be done before this can be implemented

V. Shoreline Nursing Program Updates

a) Budget Update- Gillian Lewis

- a. Welcome to Dan Fey – Dean of Workforce
- b. State budget is the same this year as it was last year – may drop for next year
- c. We have spent a lot of money this year on equipment. All students get to have the experience in Skills lab – 6 stations up and running – very important. We will be modifying the small skills lab – it will be the OB Sim lab.
- d. We are adding to our faculty – interview this week – back to 11 faculty
- e. Next year concentrate of Professional Development of nursing faculty
- f. Thank you to community members for participating in the Advisory Committee Meetings
- g. Gillian announces her retirement to the committee

b) Faculty Development Program

- a. WSNA – Incivility Workshop – this was talked about at CNEWS –last one was cancelled due to low registration

- b. Legal aspects of Nursing Education - Margaret Holm – would we be interested in having a workshop pertaining to this. Faculty agreed and Lynn will contact WSNA.
- c. Sally Watkins and Rhonda Fleming has left WSNA for other positions. Lynn will contact WSNA for another WSNA rep.
- d. Lynn is working with NWH for a faculty skills workshop.
- e. Academic Consulting Group – will be scheduled to do another workshop in the Fall – on “flipping the classroom”
- f. 5 faculty attended TeamStepps they are now Master trainers and are incorporating concepts into their curriculum.
- g. Anna Shanks provided information on the Diversity in Education Workshop she attended.
- h. BSN nurses are preferred at Swedish – but they like SCC students – it depends (900 applicants for 60 spaces) – BSNs are looked at first
 - i. Encourage students to apply and let the facility know that you are in a BSN program
 - ii. Brown Bag last week pertaining to the issue of ADN grads – you may not get a job in acute care right away – get experience in other nursing experiences
 - iii. Aeron – students take on the Brown Bag/employment – students have focus on acute care setting – letting students know that there are things that students can do to prepare themselves for acute care.
 - iv. 3rd/4th/5th quarter focus on acute care – once students take management they do see the other possibilities in nursing - In 6th quarter they do resumes and interview strategies
 - v. This is a pathway – not the destination
 - vi. It is a myth that you have to have all BSNs to achieve Magnet status? It is not in their standards but it is coming –
 - vii. It is important – to help students find their niche
- i. Diversity in our student population
 - i. Kathryn Ogden is in the SSCC Advisory Board
 - ii. Karen participated in a conference in Yakima – being able to get in to schools sooner
 - iii. Joanne – training and education funds a lot are going to people of color – important to identify what is hindering people from going into nursing programs
 - iv. ELL issue – does the SEIU have any information to help with this issue – this is seen throughout the profession – it is holding people back
 - v. Some tutors in our program – teaching ELS to students
 - vi. Men in nursing –
