- Brief remembrance of Heroic individuals, first responders (at mass shooting, Thousand Oakes and Las Vegas).

### Revised Advisory Committee Handbook ..... Lauren Hadley

- *Lauren is the advisory committee contact.*
- *The handbook is a dedication to our Professional Partners*
- *The handbook is a guideline of best practices adopted from community colleges.*
- *There are 22 advisory committees at Shoreline Community College that use the handbook.*
- *Setting Committee Goals and Work Plan – Use guided pathway for students from High School to College.*

Discussion – Committee Membership ..... Chief Compaan

- Need members to join from different agencies in the community (insurance agencies, social service agencies, and mental health professionals).
- Committee Chair and Vice Chair, are the facilitators of the meetings
- Will meet three times a year
- *Program review- look at courses in Criminal Justice.*
- *Look at data and show statistically what is happening in program*
- *Need to integrate social workers into law enforcement:*
  - *Need to train on crisis intervention and other mental health entities, start with the colleges and course offerings. Such as: CJ 135 (Nura Shah teaches), Crime Prevention through Community Partnerships.*
  - *Develop more classes in Criminal Justice and market them, get the word out to students and other colleges (Tacoma, Oregon, and Idaho).*
  - Issues brought up by members – need to develop more interest from the mental health professionals (MHP) in working with law enforcement. Only one MHP in Shoreline.
  - *Navigator will track individuals and help with housing and work.*
  - *Need at least one MHP to help with Mental Health issues including suicidal individuals and to work case management, and coordinate with schools and families..*
  - *Look at what college students are interested in and create a path/track that incorporates: mental health, social work, and risk analysis. Get students early in their program/path and hire them at the police departments.*

- *Scheduled quarterly, next one on May 13, 2019. Volunteers: Bothell PD, WSP, and Mukilteo PD*
- *Departments will attempt to have canine attend.*
- *New ideas: Cup with a pup or Hug a cop.*

Program Updates ..... Linda Forst

- *Crime Prevention Class (CJ 135), had good review and will hopefully run. Tried to make this course a core requirement, but at this time it is only an elective.*
- *We still need placement for four interns. Chief Cheol Kang will take one at the Mukilteo PD.*

- Thursday meeting at Highline Community College with representatives of other CJ programs around the state.
  - Consultant hired by legislature presented info on the study they are doing as they gather information from all constituents regarding police academy training.
  - Working on common course numbering for CJ classes in the AAAS program.
