#### **Welcome and Introductions (Tracy)**

#### **Program Update and Status Report**

- Dean Mary Burroughs: general update on HSAMCC Building. Meetings with President Roberts and DH Faculty and discussing partnerships. Plans delayed for 1 year, and Class of 2021 will stay at SCC for their 2<sup>nd</sup> year in the program. Discussed different discussions that did not work with Neighborcare, Seattle Central, CHC, SeaMar. UW and Dean Chiodo are interested in having a SCC program at the UW. Short term to figure out long term plans. Hopes to accept a class in the Fall 2020 (Class of 2022). CODA reports need to be submitted and have a solid plan for admitting a new cohort.
- Discussions about long term UW motivation: dental students able to do more restorative and DDS/DH student have collaborative learning. Classes, labs, clinicals all at UW – SCC faculty, admissions, degrees from SCC.
- Questions about the screening of patients at UW – is it efficient? Takes 3-4 appointments to begin treatment
- Edmonds CC – not a short term solution, do not have current space for a new program
- Rosie and Dr. Kintner are contacting UW for visits
- Evelyn provided an update about work with CODA and Michelle Smith. Need a robust report by April 15, 2020 called “Program Change Report”. This report can be modified by June 1, 2020. It then gets reviewed in committee and commission meets in August, 2020 to make a final decision.
- Dr. Aw asked about financial arrangements. Asked to confirm that if the CFOs from UW and SCC are having discussions about upper campus and dental hygiene – how can we assure that finances go towards dental and dental hygiene education?

- Evelyn mentioned that new applications for Class of 2022 could be opened, but needs to include a careful presentation of conditions to applicants
- Discussion about the future cohort of the DH program and the cost efficient ratio of students and instructors
- Evelyn clarified that these details depend on the clinical sites that will be identified, and there is no “magic number” for the new cohort at this time
- Hanna asked about the status of the BAS program – it is not included in the current CODA report, but encouraged to keep plans for the future
- Discussion about additional resources for the BAS program
- Rosie clarified that we would add courses in educational methodology and tuition for 300-400 level courses would be increased, about doubled
- Randy Ogata DDS: presented an update about meeting with the administrators at Edmonds Community College. He is now at SKCDS full time as the Executive Director. Suggested local contacts could be explored to facilitate communication with CODA in our district. Stated concerns about location of UW : geographically isolated and Sand Point Clinic is far away. Emphasized the need of clinics in areas of the underserved patients. Dr. Friedrich had made a contact with Edmonds Community College to explore possible partnership. Our team met with the EdCC President Singh and four Deans. They have a budget that works, and we can get information from sources that we trust. The current problem is there is no clinical space for a new program. Also introduced the “Arizona Model” where treatment is provided at remote sites. These styles of options could be explored and applied to the potential partnership between SCC dental hygiene and Edmonds Community College.
- Discussed student needs: especially 1<sup>st</sup> year students need a “home base” and a pre-clinical area
- Tracy Wayman DDS mentioned that to decrease cost of clinical spaces, satellite sites could be used
- Randy Ogata mentioned the work force shortage, and the need to train assistants and dental hygienists
- Dean Mary Burroughs: possibility to use the HP 2000 to do a FMS query form the college data analysis area. There have been 5 deans in 7 years in the HOPE Division – not a lot of consistency
- It was questioned when it was found out at SCC how the college finances were going
- Carmon: discussed adding BAS and the benefits
- Rosie discussed updating the website to inform new applicants for the Class of 2022
