Program Update and Status Report/Discussion

The program is still working with Communications and Marketing to design a brochure and referral form for the program to get out to local dentists to help with patient recruitment to the SCC Dental Hygiene Clinic. Student still complain and feel stressed about the patient pool and requirements. Patsy is finding there are less patients calling in to fill the screening clinic openings.

New Health Science Building

The state legislature and governor reached an agreement to pass a biennial capital budget, and the bonds to support the construction projects in the budget. Shoreline's Allied Health, Sciences, and Advanced Manufacturing Building and our housing project are two of those construction projects. This means the College can now begin work on planning the Allied Health, Sciences, and Advanced Manufacturing project. "The next phase of our work will be to fundraise for the \$3 million to support the Allied Health, Sciences, and Advanced Manufacturing building construction.

The college is in the preplanning of architectural design of the Allied Health Building. This building will house Dental Hygiene, HIIM, Medical Lab Tech, Biology, Chemistry and MLT. Another building located in the north parking lot will house Manufacturing. In 2-8 years another building will be built to house nursing.

Lisa Malik asked the advisory board members for their comments pertaining to the Campaign Feasibility Study to help mad a case for supporting the campaign to raise donations for the new Allied Health, Science and Advanced Manufacturing Building.

Within the discussion, the board members recommended that the building plans include provisions for the future vision of dental hygiene. With the program moving toward a BAS degree

this is good timing to consider the capabilities and development of the building for successful outcomes of the program. The inclusion of a skills lab was highly accepted due to the ability to have a space for students to practice in a separate space beside the clinic. The new building should provide room to grow with technology and more state of the art equipment.

Lisa and Rosie will take the feedback to the next Feasibility meeting.

BASDH proposal to college

The college is still moving forward with the BASDH. The target goal to present to the Statement of Need is November 2018. Rosie is researching other programs to consider and implement a Program Plan for SCC. We are looking into a degree completion program such as the Bridge program and Crosswalk to accept and provide Academic Credit for Prior Learning.

DH Application Process

FormStack program worked well and no issues the college will be moving to another program that the whole college is able to use. DH might be the first to try out, but we will get training. Katie mentioned that at Educators Conference this past February, the ADEA DHCAS was presented. Many programs are moving toward this centralized application system. Marianne felt this is the way of the future, we should look into it again. The college was waiting for the VPAT compliance. Rosie will check into this system before the decision is made to use the new program.

Implemented the \$175 acceptance fee, this will be beneficial in paying for the Association Dues for the students two years. The Class of 2020 is complete except for waiting on one candidate. We went down the alternate list to #30, two males in the class.

Equipment and Supplies

Saddle chairs are very popular with the students and faculty, we will be ordering more this spring.

Training and Development

Katie is planning the trip to Bolivia trip this summer. Ashley Castaneda will be going as the second instructor to be able to be the lead instructor next year. Katie stated that one person just declined to go. There may be an acceptance made to allow the trip to go with only 6 students. She asked if we know anyone who would be interested to let her know.
