- Clinical practice alerts – in regards to major changes to practice are in use
  - These alerts are going out at VM and Swedish
- Uptick in employee on the job injuries
  - Patients hitting and throwing things at nurses
  - Worry about students safety
  - Working with staff about setting boundaries
  - Organization wide safety huddle for communication in regards to safety concerns
    - 15 minutes to discuss issues that are currently going on

**Comment:** Let students now how important that it is to get to clinicals on time so that they don't miss out on the huddle and getting very important information.
