### **REPORT FROM THE PORTLAND TRAINING CENTER**

- Mark Scott is teaching one week a month in the Portland Training Center at this time
- Chrysler has hired two full time instructors for the training center
- There is an additional floater that will also teach out of the training center in remote stations

### **COMMITTEE DISCUSSION**
