Class Update

- There are 12 in class now

- SCC had to switch to the current program we run now
- Currently, seeking students to start the new quarter
- Instructor gives his students high expectations which some of them have never had
- Finances have been a problem over the last few years
- If your dealerships can help out with gas, the student will benefit
- Students need raises to keep up with the standard cost of living

- Challenges right now are trying to get to the high schools to promote the program and get students to come here. Michael Boehm has been taking charge of this for all the programs
- Military is a good market to find future students but the best way for that to happen is to send the instructor info on student and he will go through the process of how to get them into the program
- GM is working with UTI with 6 12 courses. Most of it is web based with some hands on. Need basic GM knowledge
- Scott Main is on the national committee working to update/modify the 30 year old model.
- We are trying to push the student to be certified as an ASEP tech and to get a college degree which requires taking some general education classes. This is not an easy task as the instructor has to continue to talk to them about this
- If the dealership could help the students with tuition this might encourage them to continue their education for that college degree

Student Placements

- Everyone has been placed in a coop
- Only 3 are not placed in the current class
- Instructor is trying to work on some south end dealers with the student
- Close dealerships are hard to get the student's in because they are already overfilled with students and cannot take on any more
