Welcome, Introductions and Approval of January Minutes - Mike Chan (Chair) Committee review and unanimously approved the March 25th minutes.

Dan gave an update on Shoreline School District

- SSD has gone to an online Acynchronous learning environment.
- SSD is anticipating a decreased state allocation of funds for the 20-21 school year and have developed a plan to accommodate possible reduction.
- SSD is developing a plan for the 20-21 school opening in the fall.

- SSD has a new program starting up in the fall and we are looking at AP Psychology making a possible shift toward a behavioral health focus.

Guy gave an update on Shoreline Community College

SCC is also looking at a decreased state allocation of funds for the 20-21 school year and are looking at all programs to decide how this reduction will be applied.

SCC has gone to an online Asynchronous learning environment for most of the programs.

Programs that require hand on work with machines are coming back to campus though for Face-To-Face Instruction following social distancing guidelines of six foot spacing, temperature testing, and personal protection equipment.
