Lauren presented the Worker Retraining Program Mix Preview This is a look at what will be submitted at the next meeting for approval. A column was added to the chart showing the median wages for each of the programs presented.

*A request was given to add the entry level wages for each of the programs as well.

Lauren led the committee in a discussion around the Needs Assessment required by the Carl Perkins grant.

- What strategies can the college put in place to recruit and retain employers participating in work-based learning experiences (tours, classroom speaking, job fairs, mock interviews, internships, etc.)? (3.D)
- How valuable is an internship experience on a resume for an entry level employee?
- What strategies can Shoreline implement to partner with stakeholders to ensure programs align with workforce needs? (3.C)

Dan gave an update on Shoreline School Public Schools

- ERDC data high school graduate outcomes and post-secondary completion data, which follows our students up to eight years after leaving high school.
- The high school CTE and SCC Workforce have pooled our funds to hire a staff person who is working directly with our high school students to navigate access college. This staff is available to all of the high school students, but is focused first on the English language students.
- We are looking into a graphic design class, which would provide dual credit and serve as a core requirement in multiple certificates or degrees.

Guy presented the College Updates:

- New college president, Dr. Jack Khan will begin July 1st
- We also have a new associate dean as well who begins April 1st.
- Discussions about masks on campus is on-going and how that is affecting enrollment.
- Our new building progress has stalled due to a cement workers strike.
- The new biomanufacturing internship program is a big hit. Students are very excited and as the college works with the companies teach, they commit less resources to this project.
